CELEBRATING 25 YEARS OF ON STAGE PERFORMANCES

In 1986, the Rappahannock Foundation, Inc. was founded by a few retirees who wanted to expand artistic activity in Lancaster and surrounding counties. The group, led by John Binns, began supporting local arts organizations and providing local concerts in the school gym. Through the efforts of these visionary founders and subsequent volunteer Board members, many meetings and fundraising activities were initiated to help build the Lancaster Middle School Theater. Then in October 1993, the On Stage premiere season curtains opened with the first performance by the Virginia Symphony. Since that time, the RFA has presented 136 On Stage productions to the community for 25 continuous years. Our current roster includes Grammy and award-winning musicians from around the globe. These exemplary performances have helped the RFA grow to become a leading arts foundation in the Northern Neck. Patrons only need to drive to Kilmarnock to see productions that often appear in Richmond, at Wolftrap, or in New York. Ms. Ellen Bray, former board member and chair of the Presenters Committee in 1993 said it best, "to have the quality performance which is being offered and have it here at home, we think the On Stage is a singular bargain".

Symphony to present 'Mozart & More' Oct. 3

From concerts to soloists to dramas, professional stage attractions are on their way to the Northern Neck as the Rappahannock Foundation for the Arts introduces its new "**On Stage**" performing arts series featuring three stellar productions beginning in the fall at the Lancaster Middle School auditorium.

"The recent Epic Brass virtuoso horn ensemble concert, sponsored by the Foundation, provided a singular example of the level of attractions," said Ellen Bray, chairman of the RFA Presenters Committee.

"Now concertgoers or playgoers who have had to travel to Richmond or Norfolk to hear a symphony or other stage attractions will find professional performances on the stage here at home," said Foundation President John Binns.

The three productions planned for the coming fall-winter-

spring **On Stage** series are the Virginia Symphony of Norfolk, the Great American Music Ensemble with the renowned jazz group of Doug Richards of Richmond, and "Dracula!" presented by Barter Theatre of Abingdon.

The Virginia Symphony will be on the Middle School auditorium stage Sunday, October 3. Doug Richards' jazz ensemble will appear Thursday, February 17, and Barter Theatre's "Dracula" will be presented Sunday, March 27.

Tickets for the **On Stage** series are \$45 total for the three productions. Tickets will be on sale at the auditorium box office from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. weekdays beginning April 12 and continuing through April 30. Mastercard and Visa are accepted. The box office phone is 435-0292.

"To have the quality performance which is being offered and have it here at home, we think the **On Stage** series is a singular bargain," Bray said.

The October 3 program will be by the 49-member "Mozart and More" ensemble of The Virginia Symphony. The program will include Ravel's "Mother Goose," and oboe concerto by Mozart and Beethoven's Symphony No. 8.

Doug Richards' Great American Music Ensemble, coming February 17, brings some of Count Basie, Duke Ellington and Fletcher Henderson. Richards' ensemble is recognized as one of the premier jazz groups in the nation.

The king of the vampires, Dracula, takes the stage March 27 as America's oldest professional equity theatre, Barter Theatre, brings melodrama at its bloodcurdling best.

ON STAGE about the artists

Back by popular demand, The Seldom Scene is the Grammy-nominated, American bluegrass band known for playing bluegrass a little differently than everyone else. Formed in 1971 in Bethesda, Maryland, The Seldom Scene has been instrumental in starting the progressive bluegrass movement by including bluegrass versions of country music, rock, and pop in their shows. For over 40 years, The Seldom Scene has been strumming, picking, and plucking tunes with flair and flourish.



The group started playing together at weekly sessions in Ben Eldridge's basement in the 1970's, with once a week performances from which the band derived their name, The Seldom Scene. As the band's reputation and popularity grew, their number of performances also increased, delighting audiences wherever they played.

When founding member John Duffey passed away in 1996, the band reached a crossroads: retire or continue on. The group loved playing music together, so they decided to continue. Band members Eldridge, Ronnie Simpkins, Dudley Connell, and Fred Travers recruited ex-member Lou Reid to rejoin the group. The final original member of The Seldom Scene, Ben Eldridge, retired in January 2016, and Rickie Simpkins stepped in. Ron Stewart replaced Rickie Simpkins in 2017.

ON STAGE about the artists

Tight melodies and impeccable musicianship are the trademark sounds the band has developed over the years. The Scene is known for their fresh interpretations of tunes by greats such as Bob Dylan, Emmylou Harris, Merle Haggard, and The Grateful Dead. So sit back, get comfortable, and listen as The Seldom Scene tells their stories as only they can.





Dudley Connell plays a masterful guitar and provides lead vocals for The Scene. Connell's renditions of traditional songs like "Old Train", folk ballads such as "Blue Diamond Mine", and blues songs like "Rollin' and Tumblin" delight audiences. Connell is a former member of the Johnson Mountain Boys. He joined The Scene in 1995.

Lou Reid plays mandolin and provides the tenor vocals for The Scene. He is also a former member of Ricky Skaggs Band, Quicksilver. He currently fronts his own group Carolina.



Ronnie Simpkins plays bass for The Scene and provides the bass vocals. Simpkins has been performing Bluegrass music since childhood and is a former member of The Tony Rice Unit.



Ron Stewart plays banjo and fiddle for the scene. A former member of the Boxcars, Stewart won the IBMA Award for Fiddle Player of the Year in 2000 and the IBMA Award for Banjo Player of the Year in 2011.



Fred Travers is one of the most respected dobro players on the bluegrass circuit today. He is also an accomplished vocalist who brings solid lead and harmony to the Scene. Travers is a former member of the Gary Ferguson Band and the Paul Adkins Band.
